

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Curtains is part of a long tradition of "backstage" musicals — Kiss Me Kate and 42nd Street are others. But I'm not sure any has depicted with such detail and witty accuracy the topsy-turvy backstage life of a company trying out a new musical out of town, as was the practice for Broadway musicals until recently. In many cases of course the production never made it to Broadway and Robbin Hood, the show being performed and rehearsed in Curtains, is in danger of suffering that fate. Kander and Ebb and the book writer Rupert Holmes, lovingly riff on the ups and downs of this exercise, along with the conflicts and emotional trials, both on and off the stage.

But, that is only part of the story. In this case a murder occurs and the whole company is under suspicion. Enter Lieutenant Cioffi, a stage struck, slightly shambolic Boston detective who eventually solves the mystery but at the same time falls in love and tries to solve the problem of the show. The character is a brilliant comic creation, originally played by very funny David Hyde Pierce - who was not really a singer. In Simon Gleeson, straight from his triumph as Valjean in Les Misérables we have a wonderful comic actor, but also a fine singer. I'm certain Kander and Ebb would be delighted to hear their beautiful songs so well sung (in new arrangements especially provided for this production).

In fact the whole cast is remarkable – an array of many of the country's finest musical theatre and comedy performers, as well as a couple of talented young performers getting their first major role. It's a cast that I'm certain would be impossible to put together for a long running commercial production. This is one of the advantages of The Production Company model, along with the fact that the emphasis has to be firmly on the material and performance, rather than the spectacle.


That said, of the many Production Company shows I have directed, this one has made the largest practical demands. The designers, Christina, Esther and Matt have risen to the challenge of making the modest production budgets go a long way...

I am writing half way through the two week rehearsal period. We are having enormous fun with its silliness and moments of great emotional charm, as well as finding many enjoyable sly references to the world we know and love. And the music, as you would expect from Kander and Ebb, is wonderful.

I hope you enjoy it as much!

Simon headed to London and continued his professional association with Gale Edwards appearing as Walter in the world premiere of *The Far Pavilions* in the West End (Whatsonstage nomination). His other UK theatre credits include the world premiere of *Imagine This* in the West End, *Three Sides, The Silver Lake*, the Edinburgh Festival season of *Certified Male* and *Shoes* for Sadler's Wells. The highlight of this time was starring as Angus in *Southwark Fair* for the Royal National Theatre, working with director, Sir Nicholas Hytner.

Simon's film and television credits in Australia include *City Homicide, Neighbours, Blue Heelers* and *SeaChange*. In London he played the regular role of Sid in *EastEnders* (BBC 1) and was a member of the principal cast of *Kombat Opera* (BBC 2) directed by Monty Python member, Terry Jones. He played Raoul in the original Australian production of Andrew Lloyd Webber's *Love Never Dies*, for which he received a Helpmann Award nomination and a Sydney Theatre Award Nomination.

In 2014 Simon was cast as Jean Valjean in the new Australian production of Cameron Mackintosh's *Les Misérables* and has been touring nationally and internationally for the past two years. For his performance in this role he has received a Helpmann Award for Best Male Actor in a Musical.

Tony also performed in his own shows at the Last Laugh and at the Flying Trapeze and all around Australia. *Curtains* sees Tony making his second appearance with the Production Company after playing Doc in 2015's hit *West Side Story* He is delighted to be back with the company and working with Roger and his creative team.

NICKI WENDT

Jessica Cranshaw

Nicki grew up in Perth, trained at WAAPA and on graduating, moved to Melbourne where she has worked continuously in all aspects of the industry. Nicki is delighted to return to The Production Company for the seventh time, her previous shows being Nice Work If You Can Get It, Gypsy, Mame, 42nd Street, Thoroughly Modern Millie and Annie Get Your Gun.

Nicki's theatre credits are extensive, having just toured in Fiddler On The Roof and the theatre adaptation of the smash hit, Mother And Son. She has appeared in dozens of productions for the MTC, including leads in The Last Man Standing, Rockabye, Three Days of Rain, Romeo and Juliet, Company, Our Country's Good, The Recruiting Officer, Measure For Measure, As You Like It, The Cherry Orchard, Les Liaisons Dangereuses and Private Lives. Nicki has directed works for Victorian Opera, including the hugely successful *Midnight Son*, for which she won the 2013 Green Room Award for best direction in opera.

HEY, MRS PRODUCER!

AN INTERVIEW WITH JANE BERGÈRE - Broadway Producer of Curtains -

Curtains was the last show created by the great Broadway duo of Kander and Ebb. It enjoyed a run of more than 500 performances on Broadway and one of its leading producers was Jane Bergère. Jane has a close association with both Jeanne Pratt and The Production Company and I was curious to know how these two dynamic women met. On the telephone from her home in New York, Jane explained:

"A mutual friend arranged for us to meet for lunch. It was love at first sight. I was absolutely bowled over by her. She was so warm and inclusive. I told her I was producing *Doctor Zhivago* in Sydney before it toured to Melbourne and she asked me down to stay in Melbourne with her. Jeanne and I became fast friends at that point."

Jane came to see The Production Company's *The Boy From Oz* and got to meet everyone in the company. She has since been a producer of *A Funny Thing Happened On The Way To The Forum* here in Melbourne, starring Geoffrey Rush and a producer of the smash hit *Kinky Boots*, which will open its Australian season at Her Majesty's Theatre on October 22.

On her first Australian visit, Jane was about to become involved in the Broadway production of *War Horse* and asked Jeanne what she thought of it. Unfortunately, Jeanne's appreciation of the show was more than slightly diminished because some little boy had thrown up on her during a London performance.

Jane commented wryly, "Had it not been for this incident, I like to think she might have invested in it!" There haven't been any further theatrical mishaps, as Jeanne has been involved with Jane's Broadway productions of Twelfth Night and Richard III, Kinky Boots, Annie and Rocky.

Jane produced *Curtains* with four other producers, Roger Berlind, Roger Horshow, Daryl Roth, Ted Hartley and the Centre Theatre Group. The Centre Theatre Group had produced the out of town try-out in Los Angeles, staging its world premiere there on July 25, 2006 at the Ahmanson Theatre – as I pointed

out to Jane, a very similar scenario, to the out-of-town tryout plot in *Curtains* itself.

The show went so well in LA that the producers decided to bring the show to New York. As Jane elaborated:

"When you play comedy you need an audience to tell you what is and isn't funny and what does and doesn't work. You can't get the sense in a rehearsal studio of whether it will or won't land. So we took *Curtains* out to Centre Stage, to the beautiful Ahmanson Theatre. The audiences loved it, and they are a sophisticated group out there. This was a great chance to work through the show, iron out the kinks and fix it before we brought it onto Broadway."

Curtains opened in New York on March 22, 2007 at the Al Hirschfeld Theatre to very good reviews. Once again directed by Scott Ellis, it starred David Hyde Pierce, best known here to Australian television audiences for *Frasier*. Pierce won a Tony Award for Best Actor in a Musical. Ben

Brantley wrote in The New York Times, David Hyde Pierce ... steps into fully-fledged Broadway stardom with his performance here. He also referred to Pierce's character of Lieutenant Cioffi as the best damn musical theatre character since Mama Rose in Gypsy and the best role of David Hyde Pierce's career. The show was nominated for eight Tony Awards. It was also nominated for ten Drama Desk awards and won two best book of a musical to Rupert Holmes and Peter Stone and outstanding featured actress in a musical to Debra Monk.

Before her career as a Broadway producer, Jane performed as an actress on Broadway and on television. This has given her a wonderful insight into the job in which she is so now so successful. She explained,

"When you create a new musical so much centres around the talent of the actors you have hired to play the parts. We were so lucky to have David Hyde Pierce, who is, and continues to be, extraordinary. He is so versatile."

The whole Broadway cast for *Curtains* were, indeed, wonderful. Debra Monk was hilarious as Carmen Bernstein. Jill Pace was terrific as Niki Harris. Karen Ziemba played Georgia Hendricks and Jason Danieley was Aaron Fox. The choreography by Rob Ashford was marvellous. Megan Sikora, as Bambi, had a wonderful star turn, with upside down cartwheels and acrobatics fashioned around her enormous talent.

So here they were, the five producers on Broadway, with an audience pleaser on their hands.

This must have been so exciting. But it was also tinged with sadness. Kander and Ebb had, over a period of four decades, created many Broadway standards and contemporary classics together. Their entire careers had been as a total team and then, sadly, at this time, Fred died.

"John and Fred really wrote as one so it was terrible when Fred passed away. Fred was the love of John's life and this terrible tragedy was obviously devastating for John and horrible for us all."

Kander and Ebb's collaborations had included *Cabaret, The Kiss of the Spider Woman* and *Chicago*. Their work also transferred itself to movies and television, as they wrote original material for the Academy Awards, *Liza With a Z* and HBO's *Liza Minnelli's Steppin' Out* (both Emmy winners), *Baryshnikov on Broadway, Goldie and Liza Together, Funny Lady, Lucky Lady, New York New York*, which became a signature song for Frank Sinatra and an anthem for the city itself, *Steppin' Out* and *Chicago*, the movie.



Jane told me the song the character of Aaron sings in *Curtains, I Miss the Music,* was written as a love letter from John to Fred: a beautiful tribute, of sweetness and humour, pathos and beautifully judged sentimentality.

The original book and concept for the show had been written by Peter Stone, best known for his screenplay for *Charade* starring Cary Grant and Audrey Hepburn. Stone died in 2003, leaving the book unfinished. Fortunately John Kander got on very well with Rupert Holmes, the British-American composer, singer-songwriter and author of plays, novels and stories, who completed the script with him. Rupert is probably best known on Broadway for his musical *The Mystery of Edwin Drood*.

"Rupert is a talented and delightful person and very sensitive to the fact that he was stepping into shoes that were very difficult to fill. Kander and Holmes worked beautifully together and Rupert made it possible for John's dream to come to fruition."

Curtains has been seen all over the world since its New York season. This staging is its professional Australian premiere, although there have been amateur productions on the Gold Coast and Adelaide in 2010 and in Warrnambool in 2011. It has toured widely through the United States and has had seasons in Scotland, Ireland,

London, Germany, Sweden, the Czech Republic, New Zealand and Canada. Jane gets royalty cheques from all over the world and will, I am sure be looking forward to receiving one soon from The Production Company.

Jane's extensive Broadway credits include *Clybourne Park, War Horse, Driving Miss Daisy* starring James Earl Jones and Vanessa Redgrave; *A Little Night Music* starring Catherine Zeta-Jones and Angela Lansbury; *La Cage aux Folles* starring Kelsey Grammer and Douglas Hodge; *All My Sons* starring John Lithgow and Katie Holmes; Mark Twain's *Is He Dead?* starring Norbert Leo Butz; *Glengarry Glen Ross* starring Alan Alda, Liev Schreiber, Frederick Weller, Gordon Clapp, Jeffrey Tambor, Tom Wopat and Jordan Lage; *Caroline, or Change* by Pulitzer Prize-winning playwright Tony Kushner; Mary Zimmerman's *Metamorphoses* and *It Shoulda Been You*, starring Tyne Daly and directed by David Hyde Pierce.

I asked this most accomplished woman about John Kander and Fred Ebb and their Broadway legacy.

"Fred and John only did very interesting pieces. They started out way back with Flora the Red Menace, which introduced a rising new star Liza Minnelli. I remember it well as I was performing in the theatre next door with Bette Midler in one of the many productions I did of Fiddler on the Roof. Cabaret soon followed and then Zorba. which was different but more or less in the same line. Then there was show called Happy Time, which wasn't the blockbuster that the others had been. Woman of the Yearwas very successful and they both loved Chita Rivera and wrote The Kiss of the Spider Woman as a tour de force for her. Their Steel Pier has been staged several times in London. They created television shows like Liza with a Z, (who, along with Chita, they described as the other woman in our lives). The Visit, again starring Chita, was their last show on Broadway (it had had an earlier Chicago season). This is a really difficult and gruesome piece to musicalize. It's so raw. What this woman goes through for revenge! This is probably their darkest work."

In the comedic sunlight of *Curtains* there are two moments for Jane that

are touching, serious, thoughtful and introspective - Aaron's *I Miss the Music* and Cioffi's song *Coffee Shop Nights* about his lonely life and his marriage to his job. Jane marvels that this is the one Kander and Ebb musical that is so much fun, even though the creative process was so tinged with sadness. It is remarkable that the genius of Kander and Ebb plus Holmes burst forth at the time they did with *Curtains*, a work of celebration of life and joy, and described by one of the critics as having plenty of laugh-out loud one-liners and some great tunes.

"You are going to have such fun with this show. I wish I could be there to see it. Of all the shows and all the different things I have done, this is definitely one of my favourites."



In 2010, *The Sisters Hayes* were nominated for a Green Room Award for their production design of Finucane & Smith's *Carnival of Mysteries*, in its premiere at the Melbourne International Arts Festival.

A BACKGROUND NOTE ON THE PRODUCTION COMPANY

The Production Company's ambitions centre on two key policies.

The first is to provide employment to artists living and working in Melbourne. When Jeanne Pratt started The Production Company in 1998, there were few professional opportunities for young performers in musical theatre. In the 18 years since then, the situation has vastly improved.

The company's second ambition is to bring quality entertainment at the best prices to Melbourne musical-theatre goers. In 2016, anybody under the age of 18 can enjoy one of our performances for just \$24, and an adult subscriber can pay as little as \$42 to see a performance.

The Production Company has always employed artists at above Equity Award pay rates and provided them with first-rate directors, choreographers and musical directors working with a full orchestra. The bulk of our budget goes towards realising these crucial goals. Financing sets and costumes is of more minimal concern, as they have limited direct benefit in developing the skills of our musical-theatre artists.

This year, The Production Company is engaging more than 90 artists on four-week minimum contracts. This amounts to close to 400 weeks of full-time employment for artists in Melbourne. From the 2016 season, and after many years with Orchestra Victoria, we have formed our own orchestra, for which we pay full commercial rates.

The Production Company is fully subsidised with private funding, for which we thank our legion of generous supporters and private patrons. We have never sought Government arts funding.

In terms of repertoire, a great deal of research goes into selecting the best works to suit available talent. We take great care in ensuring that our artists are cast in roles that display their talents to the finest level. Our success rate can be judged by the many performers who have gone on to star in major commercial musicals.

Our repertoire is balanced between the great classic shows that audiences know and love, such as *West Side Story* and this year's *Funny Girl*, as well as lesser-known works that we hope audiences will come to love — among them, the multi-award-winning Australian premiere of *Grev Gardens*. *Nice Work If You Can Get It* and now *Curtains*.

The shows of the future are also a vital part of The Production Company's life. To assist with the creative development of new musicals, the company has made many awards to professional composers and writers through Pratt Foundation Commissions and Awards. We have been able to provide some of the best and brightest with professional workshops to help realise their creative dreams.


