
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

SILVIE PALADINO

Silvie is one of Australia's most versatile and talented entertainers.

Her first theatrical role was Eponine in the Australasian tour of *Les Misérables*. She was then invited to perform the same role in the London production on the West End. In 1997, Silvie returned to London where she performed the role of Fantine in *Les Misérables* for a successful two-year season.

Silvie's other Australasian credits include her one-woman show *Silvie Paladino Sings Streisand* (Green Room Award nomination), the role of Jeannie in *Hair*, Grizabella in the Australian and Asian tour of *Cats*, Ellen in Cameron Mackintosh's Australian premiere of *Miss Saigon*, Donna in *Mamma Mial*, Rita in the world premiere of *Sideshow Alley* and Clara in *Passion*. Jerry's Girls marks Christie Whelan Browne's eighth show with The Production Company, having appeared in Nice Work If You Can Get It as Eileen Evergreen earlier this year, Sugar, The Boy Friend, The Producers, Anything Goes, and Singin' in the Rain.

Christie's career began in *Grease: The Arena Spectacular*, playing the role of Patti Simcox, and she went on to play the role again in London.

In 2008 she won the Sydney Critics Award for Best Newcomer for her role as April in Gale Edward's *Company*.

She has been seen at the MTC in *The Drowsy Chaperone*, (for which she was nominated for a Helpmann award for Best Actress in a Musical) and also as Gwendolyn in *The Importance of Being Earnest*.

Other musicals include Kira in *Xanadu*, Philia in *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum*, Elizabeth Hurley in *Shane Warne: The Musical* and Janet Weiss in *The Rocky Horror Show*.

In 2009, Christie first performed her one-woman show *Britney Spears: The Cabaret* at the Adelaide Cabaret Festival, which has toured nationally and received rave reviews and multiple award nominations.

Christie's television credits include roles in *Wonderland, Offspring, Winners and Losers, House Husbands, Miss Fisher's Murder Mysteries, INXS: Never Tear Us Apart, Paper Giants, Open Slather* and *Peter Allen: Not the Boy Next Door* in which she played Olivia Newton John.

In 2016, she will be seen in a new film by Tim Ferguson called Spin Out and ABC's The Divorce.

For The Production Company Natalie has performed the roles of Polly in *Crazy for You* and Kim MacAffe in *Bye Bye Birdie.*





FRANK VAN STRATEN SAYS 'HELLO' TO JERRY'S GIRLS

When Jerry Herman was about fourteen years old, his parents took him to see Ethel Merman in Irving Berlin's *Annie Get Your Gun*. 'It absolutely did it for me,' he recalled in his autobiography. 'I said to myself, "Okay, kid, this is it. This is the most exciting thing in the whole world. It doesn't get any better than this".'

Just a few years later, Jerry was being hailed as being Berlin's successor, a master of musical comedy and the creator of a catalogue of showtunes sparkling with many of Broadway's biggest hits.

Jerry was only 25 when he had his first hit show, a snappy revue called *Nightcap*. It ran for two years in a small Greenwich Village nightclub and paved the way for another revue, *Parade*, in 1960. In *Parade*, Jerry recycled a song he'd written years before. It was called '*Showtune*':


'There's just no tune As exciting as a showtune... When it's played, you can just tell There's footlights everywhere. When it's played, you can just smell The greasepaint in the air...'

'I was about sixteen when I wrote that song,' says Jerry, 'and it pretty much explains what I'm all about. It's obvious that I was madly in love with musical comedy; I still am. It's one of the few purely American art forms we have – and we still do it better than anybody.'

Well, certainly Jerry still does it better than anybody. His work is unashamedly in the grand Irving Berlin tradition of big stars, great ballads, and show-stopping production numbers and, like Berlin, he writes all the music and all the lyrics.

Jerry is the only composer-lyricist to

have three shows run over 1500 performances on Broadway: *Hello, Dolly!, Mame* and *La Cage aux Folles*. He's won countless awards and accolades, including two Tonys, but he's had his disappointments, too. *Mack and Mabel* and *Dear World*

may now have cult followings, but their first productions were lacklustre. *The Grand Tour* is all but forgotten. Nevertheless, no Herman show is without its share of signature showtunes, and every one of them is worth hearing.

That's what young Broadway producer Larry Alford thought when he suggested to Jerry that they collaborate on a retrospective of his career. 'I had always wanted to write some kind of musical tribute saluting all the women who had ever been in my shows,' says Jerry, 'so we got the idea of doing a revue in which all the performers were women – even the conductor.'

With Alford directing, *Jerry's Girls* opened in August 1981 at Ted Hook's Onstage, a showbiz supper club in the heart of the Times Square theatre district. In a rave review in *The New York Times*, John S. Wilson welcomed 'a brilliantly lively and scintillating evening of cabaret'. Jerry recalls: 'It became such a hot ticket that it ran and ran – just like that first little show of mine, *Nightcap*.'

In 1983, following the triumph of *La Cage aux Folles*, Broadway producer Zev Bufman suggested remounting *Jerry's Girls* on a larger scale. Now *La Cage's* lovely Zaza could share the spotlight with Jerry's other larger-than-life ladies: Dolly, Mame, Mabel Normand and *Dear World's* Countess Aurelia.

Carol Channing, Leslie Uggams and Andrea McArdle were the stars of the revamped show when it premiered on 28 February 1984 at the Royal Poinciana Playhouse in Palm Beach, Florida. After a triumphant national tour, the new *Jerry's Girls* reached Broadway, where it opened on 18 December 1985 at the St James – the theatre that had hosted *Hello, Dolly!* for so long. Andrea McArdle was still in the show, but now her co-stars were Dorothy Loudon and Chita Rivera. 'It should run at least forever,' said Clive Barnes in *The New York Post.* In fact it

ran for 141 performances, and has been consistently revived around the US ever since.

Then, according to Jerry, 'It became an absolute phenomenon in Australia. The show went out in 1987 in a production directed by Larry Alford. It had barely closed before there was a demand to bring it back, so it went right back and became Australia's biggest hit.' Maybe not exactly, but Australians certainly fell in love with *Jerry's Girls*.

The show was produced by the Gordon/Frost Organisation. Comparative newcomers, John Frost and Ashley Gordon were presenting innovative smaller-scale shows at their home base, the Footbridge Theatre in Sydney, where they'd struck gold with *Nunsense* and the Fats Waller tribute *Ain't Misbehavin'*. Frost and Gordon presented *Jerry's Girls* in partnership with J.C. Williamson Productions, a company continuing the great traditions of 'The Firm' that had dominated Australian theatre for a century.

For *Jerry's Girls* they recruited some of the best female talent in the country: Debra Byrne, Judi Connelli, Jeanne Little – in her first ever stage show – Marcia Hines and Lola Nixon. Roger Kirk designed the sets and costumes, Ross Coleman choreographed, Sue Nattrass lit the show, Frank Esler-Smith conducted, and Larry Alford directed, as he had done in New York. 'He was wonderful,' recalls Frost. 'And he just lived and breathed Jerry Herman's music.'

Reviewing the premiere at the Footbridge on 30 July 1987, The Australian predicted: '*Jerry's Girls* will dazzle the eye and twig the funny bone.' A smash success, the Sydney season was reported to have made \$1.5 million.

The show transferred to the Comedy in Melbourne in October, with Angela Ayers replacing Debra Byrne, who had been cast as Fantine in *Les Misérables*. The *Herald's* Jason Daniel



noted that, 'The rather grand Broadway spectacular has been scaled down and Australianised so that it becomes a broader and more irreverent show which, for all its expensive costuming, revels in a certain joyful cabaret tackiness.' Joan Rivers, in town for a season at the Hilton, took in a matinee and told the press the show was, 'wonderful, fantastic, superb and super-exciting'.

The show then had a return Sydney season before the company visited Adelaide and Brisbane, where its season on the River Stage was a highlight of the entertainment component of Expo 88.

The show was mothballed until April 1991, when it re-emerged in fine form at the Footbridge. David Penfold, who had been assistant director in 1987, returned to direct the original cast. In August the show played at the Canberra Theatre. Judi Connelli, Marcia Hines, Jeanne Little and Lola Nixon were back, with Jackie Love taking over from a very pregnant Angela Ayers. There was another run in Brisbane in April 1992.

Since then there have been occasional non-professional productions but, until now, no full-scale revival. Still, we've fared better than Britain. Londoners did not meet Jerry's Girls until it enjoyed a three-week run at the tiny Jermyn Street Theatre in May this year. Reviewer Stephen Collins called it 'A genuinely terrific night in the musical theatre... There is nothing to touch it currently playing in London in terms of value for money and sheer, unrelenting happiness.'

And now - at last - Jerry's Girls is back in town, bigger and brighter and bubblier than ever. 'Sheer, unrelenting happiness', indeed. It doesn't get any better than this!


