TODD McKENNEY

ALBIN

Inspiring, provocative, compelling and generous are just a few words that describe the critically acclaimed and award winning performer, actor and host Todd McKenney.

A household name in Australia, Todd's versatile career has spanned three decades and shows no sign of slowing down. Already known as

Australia's leading man of song and dance musicals, since 1994 he's also been the colourful and often controversial judge on the Seven Network's hit series *Dancing With the Stars*.

Todd began dancing at the age of three at his mother's dancing school in Perth, training in jazz, tap, acrobatics and ballroom dancing. He has represented Australia in ballroom and Latin American dancing, winning many international dance titles. Among his Australian awards for performance in musical theatre are two Mo Awards, the Variety Club Heart Award, the Glug Award, the Green Room Award, two Australian Dance Awards and a Helpmann Award.

He was cast in his first professional musical, Andrew Lloyd Webber's *Song and Dance*, in 1983. Leading roles followed in Cats, 42nd Street, West Side Story, Crazy For You, Born Yesterday, Camelot, The Pirates of Penzance, Cabaret, Strictly Ballroom, La Cage Aux Folles, Singin' In the Rain, Anything Goes, The Boy From Oz, Priscilla Queen of the Desert, Annie and most recently Todd headlined in the role of Teen Angel in *Grease*.

It was landing the prized role of Peter Allen in the Australian hit production *The Boy From Oz* that confirmed his star status on stage. *The Boy From Oz* performed over 900 shows nationally and is one of the longest running and most successful musical productions in Australian history.

For The Production Company Todd has re-created the role of Peter Allen in its 2011 and 2012 seasons of *The Boy From Oz* and in 2011 Todd was Lord Evelyn Oakleigh in *Anything Goes* for The Production Company.

Todd co-hosted Sydney's MIX106.5FM breakfast radio program with Sonia Kruger in 2008 and 2009

He regularly fills in for Larry Emdur on Channel 7's, *The Morning Show* with Kylie Gillies. He has also filled in as a judge on *Australia's Got Talent* on the Seven Network.

In 2013 Todd played the role of Pluto in the 2013 Opera Australia season of *Orpheus In the Underworld*.

For the past six years Todd has been studying Auslan sign language and has worked within the deaf community all around Australia. He also works for the Children's Cancer Institute Australia on their Diamond Ball Committee and helps raise funds for research to find a cure for children's cancer.

Todd became a father in 2007 and his daughter Charlotte is the light of his life.

SIMON BURKE

GEORGES

One of Australia's most accomplished, respected and versatile performers, Simon began his career at the age of thirteen when he starred in Fred Schepisi's acclaimed feature film *The Devil's Playground* for which he won the AFI Award for Best Actor. Since then he has enjoyed great success both in Australia and the UK in film, television, stage, concert appearances and cabaret.



Simon returned to the UK in 2007 to star as Captain von Trapp opposite Connie Fisher and Summer Strallen in *The Sound of Music* at the London Palladium. Since then he has appeared as Joe in *When The Rain Stops Falling* at the Almeida Theatre, starred as Georges opposite John Barrowman's Albin in *La Cage Aux Folles* at the Playhouse Theatre, London, and in *Holding The Man* at the Trafalgar Studios as well as reprising his role in *The Sound of Music* at Toronto's Princess of Wales Theatre.

Earlier UK theatre credits include Carl-Magnus in *A Little Night Music* at the (Royal National Theatre, Raoul in Phantom of the Opera (Her Majesty's Theatre), Leonardo in *Leonardo – A Portrait of Love* (Old Fire Station Oxford) Cliff in *Cabaret* (Crucible Theatre, Sheffield) Steve in *Jeffrey* (Greenwich Theatre) and *The Life of the World to Come* (Almeida Theatre).

Australian musical theatre credits include Marius in the original Australian cast of *Les Miserables*, Vernon in *They're Playing Our Song*, Harry in *Company*, Billy Flynn in *Chicago*, Whizzer in *Falsettos* (nominated Best Musical Performance Sydney Theatre Critics' Circle Awards), Burrs in *The Wild Party*, George Puttnam in *Take Flight* and Billy Crocker in *Anything Goes*, for which he received the Green Room Award for Best Actor in a Musical. For The Production Company, Simon performed the role of Dexter Haven in *High Society*.

Sydney Theatre Company productions include *Jonah Jones, The Herbal Bed, She Stoops to Conquer, Mr Kolpert* and the world premiere of *Up For Grabs.* Simon played Mason Marzac in the Australian premiere of *Take Me Out* for the Melbourne Theatre Company and starred in the world premieres of *October* and *Satango* for Griffin Theatre Company. He created the role of Francis Bacon in Stephen Sewell's acclaimed *Three Furies* directed by Jim Sharman for 2005 Sydney Festival, 2006 Perth and Adelaide Festivals (nominated Best Actor Sydney Theatre Awards 2006).

Simon's many television credits include Hustle, Rescue: Special Ops, The Alice, All Saints, Small Claims III, Thank God You're Here, South Pacific, Brides of Christ, Scales of Justice, Water Rats, Danielle Steele's The Ring, The One That Got Away, Heroes Mountain, After the Deluge, Grass Roots, Preservation and Postcard Bandit, and his 23-year stint as one of the most popular presenters on ABC TV's Play School. In 2006 he hosted his own television variety series Studio A With Simon Burke on Australia's FOXTEL network. Feature films include Passion, Pitch Black, and Travelling Light. From their inauguration in 2001 until 2006 Simon hosted and co-wrote the Helpmann Awards - honouring excellence in live performance in Australia.

In January 2009 Simon was thrilled to make his debut at Carnegie Hall, where he hosted and performed in a gala concert *Australia Plays Broadway.*

His new solo show, titled *Something About Always*, had its world premiere at the Adelaide Cabaret Festival on June 17th 2011. His first solo album, also titled *Something About Always*, which he co-produced with Musical Director Daniel Edmonds, was released in 2009 and is available in the foyer and on itunes.



RHONDA BURCHMORE OAM

JACQUELINE

With a smile that could light up the Sydney Opera house and a voice that's as big, bold and colourful as Uluru, Rhonda Burchmore has endeared herself to the hearts of all Australians.

After twenty-five years in the business, this vivacious, flame-haired beauty continues to turn heads wherever she goes and draws thunderous applause wherever she performs.

She has forged a lengthy career in one of the toughest and most unforgiving industries, show business, yet as critics attest, she just keeps going from strength to strength.

Few Australian entertainers have shared her status and immense popularity amongst her peers, who admire Rhonda for her big personality, big heart and enormous capacity to give back to the industry that has shaped her career.

For The Production Company Rhonda performed the title role in *Mame* in seasons in 1999 and 2008 and in 2009, Rhonda was Madame Dubonnet in *The Boy Friend*.

Anne's career commenced with the original Melbourne production of *Cats*, after which she travelled to Europe to join the German production. She consequently spent six successful years working overseas.

A Swell Party marked her London West End debut when she stepped in for the leading lady on the opening night of the premiere.

Other UK and European credits include lead roles in Aspects of Love, Barnum, Crazy for You,

Romance Romance, Into the Woods and Closer Than Ever.

Her Australian credits include the roles of Irene in *Crazy For You*, Elsa Schraeder in *The Sound Of Music*, The Journalist in *Minefields And Miniskirts*, Mrs. Mullin in *Carousel*, The Soap Star in *Menopause The Musical*, Phyllis in *Follies*, Meg in *Damn Yankees*, Magenta in *The Rocky Horror Show*, Evangeline Harcourt in *Anything Goes*, Madame Morrible in *Wicked* and Muriel Eubanks in *Dirty Rotten Scoundrels*.

Anne is perhaps best known for her portrayal of Donna in the Australian premiere of *Mamma Mia!* earning her a Green Room Award and an invitation to play the role on London's West End. She re-created this award-winning role for the national tour which celebrated the shows 10th anniversary.

Anne most recently revisited the role of Madame Morrible for the Melbourne season of *Wicked* and played the role of Sara Jane Moore in Stephen Sondheim's *Assassins*.

Marg first appeared on television as part of *The D-Generation* in the late 1980s and subsequently appeared regularly in *Fast Forward*, *Full Frontal*, *Something Stupid* and *Kath and Kim*. 

This led him to win several awards including an AFI award for Best Actor in a Leading Role in a Television Drama (1991/1992), the Variety Club



Heart Award for TV Actor of the Year (1993), and two TV Week Silver Logie Awards for Most Popular Actor and Most Outstanding Actor (1992/1994). Other television projects include *The Great Bookie Robbery, Come in Spinner, Children of the Dragon, The Battlers, Blue Murder, Cold Feet, Stingers, The Circuit, Rain Shadow, The Pacific, Small Time Gangster and most recently, House Husbands.*

Films include The Lighthorseman, The Dreaming, Indecent Obsession, Love in Ambush, The Tracker, Alexandra's Project, Getting Square, Macbeth, 2:37, Bitter & Twisted, Subdivision, The Chronicles of Narnia: The Voyage of the Dawn Treader, Two Mothers, Fatal Honeymoon, Nerve and most recently, Charlie's Country. Though most recognized for his screen roles, Sweet has appeared in The Club and The Recruit for MTC, and the musicals Oh, What a Night and Little Orphan trASHLEY. Most recently Gary narrated Our Don for the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra.

Originally from Melbourne, Aljin graduated from NIDA in 2006. He has worked as an actor both nationally and internationally in film, television, animation, theatre and voice-over. He made his stage debut in the MTC and Belvoir Street seasons of *The Sapphires* in 2005 and reprised his role in their subsequent South Korean and London tours

For The Production Company, Aljin has previously appeared in Anything Goes. 
LA CAGE AUX FOLLES

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, WELCOME TO THE QUEEN OF BASIN STREET, WELL, NOT REALLY, BUT THAT'S WHAT YOU MIGHT HAVE BEEN SEEING IF THINGS HAD TURNED OUT DIFFERENTLY.

To make a short story long, let's go back to the Théâtre du Palais-Royal in Paris on 1 February 1973. That's when the curtain rose on an unpretentious little comedy called La Cage Aux Folles. There was no music and only one set: all the action took place in the drawing room of the gay owners of an adjacent drag nightclub in the fashionable French resort town of Saint Tropez. The play's author and star was Jean Poiret - the professional name of Gustave Jean Perry, the son of a glazier and a book-keeper. Though he was and still is - virtually unknown outside France. Poiret's long career included roles in more than seventy films and many stage productions. He also worked on a

dozen screenplays and wrote ten stage comedies, usually designed to display his considerable comedic talents. He was Georges in that landmark first production of *La Cage*, with Michel Serrault as Albin. The two men had met at drama school and enjoyed a long-lasting stage partnership. A huge hit, *La Cage Aux Folles* packed the Palais-Royal for 1800 performances.

In 1978, on a visit to Paris, producer Allan Carr was taken to see *La Cage*. Still basking in the success of his film version of *Grease*, Carr was looking for a new project. He immediately sensed the potential in Poiret's play. 'I wanted to do it as a movie for Tony Curtis and Jack Lemmon,' he said. 'It would have been a reminder of what they had done in *Some Like it Hot*.' When he heard that the film rights had already gone to a French-Italian company, Carr thought of staging the play in London, but he soon realised

that its potential for spectacle and its warm family relationships were the elements 'of those big Broadway musicals we don't see anymore'. He felt that the impending international release of the film was of little consequence, as foreign-language comedies rarely did well in the US.

As it turned out, he was wrong about the film's American appeal. It was a box office blockbuster, running in New York for more than a year and becoming the highest-grossing foreign-language film released in the US to that time. There were two sequels, La Cage Aux Folles 2 and 3. In all three, Serrault was again Albin, but Ugo Tognazzi replaced Poiret. In 1979 the US ABC TV network considered recycling the characters in a TV sitcom to be called Adam and Yves, but this came to nothing.

Carr was undeterred, even encouraged. Having paid Poiret a \$100,000 advance, he set about recruiting a creative team for his musical. He spoke with authors John Mortimer and Larry Gelbart, composers Marvin Hamlisch, Peter Allen, John Kander and Fred Ebb, and directors Michael Smuin, Jack Hofsiss and Frank Dunlop. Eventually he announced that Jay Allen Presson would write the book, Maury Yeston (the composer of Nine) would write the music and Mike Nichols and Tommy Tune would direct. The action would be relocated from Saint Tropez to New Orleans and the show would be

called – yes – *The Queen of Basin Street.* Yeston made a four-track demo recording designed to attract investors, but eventually the whole project unravelled in acrimony.

Near desperation, Carr hired Barry Brown and Fritz Holt as executive producers. They promptly ditched the original creative team and replaced them with director Arthur Laurents (*Gypsy*), writer Harvey Fierstein (*Torch Song Trilogy*) and composer Jerry Herman (*Mame, Hello, Dolly!*). For Herman it was a dream come true. He had fallen in love with the film and had tried to get the stage rights himself. The three worked together swiftly and smoothly, restoring the original setting and title, and adding warmth and depth to the characters. George Hearn was cast as Albin and Gene Barry as Georges.

Against all advice, Carr decided to preview the \$5 million show in ultra-conservative Boston. 'Why not?' he reasoned. 'The show's got heart and humanity. It has a touching story. It's really a romantic domestic drama. It's Life with Father or Life with Mother or whatever.' Carr's punt paid off. The first night audience gave La Cage a standing ovation. 'There were little old ladies standing up in their walkers and cheering,' Carr recalled. 'They were the oldest theatregoers I ever saw, and they were all cheering!'

La Cage Aux Folles opened at the Palace Theatre on Broadway on 21 August 1983. Though the Boston tryout had virtually guaranteed its success, nobody had dreamed how big its triumph would be. It was nominated for nine Tony awards and won six, including the coveted Best Musical. La Cage ran for four years – 1761 performances – during which there were a number of cast changes. Two notable replacement Georges were Van Johnson and Adelaide-born Keith Michell.

Michell also headed the West Coast company and, in 1985, returned to Australia to star with Jon Ewing as Albin in the Australian production, the first outside the US. The supporting cast included David Ravenswood (Dindon), Ronne Arnold (Jacob), Gordon Boyd (Renaud), Leigh Chambers (Francis), Lisa O'Dea (Anne), Arianthe Galani (Jacqueline), Geraldene Morrow (Marie Dindon) and Gerry Sont (Jean-Michel). Todd McKenney was one of the Cagelles. Arthur Laurents directed.

The show played at Her Majesty's in Sydney and at the Palais in Melbourne. Said Bob Crimeen in *The Sun*: 'You saw the film, you've heard about the musical... now go and see it. What other advice could one offer after Saturday night's glittering Broadwayish opening of this smash-hit musical?' *La Cage* sailed gaily on. It hit the London Palladium in 1986 with George Hearn as Albin and Dennis Quilley as Georges. Germany, Colombia, Mexico, Spain, Portugal, Korea, New Zealand, Denmark – on and on it went.

The show returned to Broadway in 2004 for a 229-performance run during which Robert Goulet replaced the original Georges. A second Broadway revival in 2010 featured Kelsey Grammer as Georges and Douglas Hodge as Albin; he was later replaced by Harvey Fierstein. This production went 'on the road' with George Hamilton as Georges. Both productions garnered Tony awards for Best Revival of a Musical, making *La Cage Aux Folles* the only show to have won the Best Production award every time it has appeared on Broadway.

La Cage was revived in London in 2008 with Douglas Hodge as Albin and Australia's Philip Quast as Georges. Later London Albins included Graham Norton and John Barrowman, and for a while our own Simon Burke played Georges.

But until now, Australia has not been so lucky – revivals of *La Cage* have been left to enterprising non-professional groups. Adelaide's Mayfair Theatre Company staged it at Her Majesty's there in 1997, while the National Theatre in St Kilda saw a Festival Theatre production in 1990 and Quirky Productions' ambitious 2012 pro-am version with David Rogers-Smith as Albin and John O'May as Georges.

And we mustn't forget *The Birdcage*, the 1996 United Artists film. It was adapted from the first *La Cage* movie, not from the play or the musical, and was reset in the colourful gay enclave at Miami, Florida. Originally Steve Martin was cast as Armand/ Georges with Robin Williams as Albert/Albin, but when Martin withdrew, Robin Williams switched to Armand/Georges and Nathan Lane, in his breakthrough movie role, played Albert/Albin. Mike Nichols directed. The original play has been restaged several times in Paris. The 2009 revival at the Théâtre de Porte Saint-Martin starred

Christian Clavier as Georges and Didier Bourdon as Albin. It was so successful that it was filmed live on stage and screened on French TV in 2011. Though they're in French, the excerpts accessible on YouTube are well worth checking out: they provide an excellent idea of what that original 1973 Paris production must have been like.

And what of the remarkable Monsieur Poiret, who had created *La Cage* in 1973 and had seen it soar to success around the world. Though *La Cage* made him extremely wealthy, he continued to work on stage and television. He was 65 when he died of a heart attack in Paris in 1992, three months before the release of *Zebra*, the only film he directed. He is buried with many of France's artistic elite in the Montparnasse Cemetery.

And what of *The Queen of Baker Street?* 'I still love the music from that show,' says Carr wistfully. 'Maybe someday I'll produce that too.'


