The February performances of The Boy From Oz celebrate a new collaboration. The Arts Centre is co-presenting this additional season and I am delighted. The other exciting development is that the


Capitol Theatre in Sydney is taking our company in this show into their theatre for a season starting at the end of February.

TODD MCKENNEY

Peter Allen

Inspiring, provocative, compelling film actor, musical theatre performer, television personality and radio host, Todd McKenney knows show business from every angle.

Since 2004, Todd has enjoyed his role as a judge on Channel 7's immensely popular *Dancing With The Stars*. He has also been guest presenter and guest host on *The Morning Show* and on Channel 7's *Sydney Weekender*. Todd was also host of *Celebrity Spelling Bee*.

Todd has represented Australia in Ballroom and Latin American dancing, winning many international dancing titles – perfect training for his role as Nathan Starkey in Baz Luhrmann's internationally acclaimed film Strictly Ballroom.

He was cast in his first professional musical, Andrew Lloyd Webber's Song And Dance in 1983. From chorus roles in shows like Born Yesterday for The Sydney Theatre Company, Pirates Of Penzance and Camelot, he moved on to small roles like Phaedra in La Cage Aux Folles and Tumblebrutus and Rum Tug Tugger in Cats. He then landed leads as Billy Lawler in 42nd Street and Riff in West Side Story. In Crazy For You he proved he had what it takes to become a star.

After landing the prized role of Peter Allen in the critically acclaimed Australian hit *The Boy From Oz*, Todd played the role for 766 performances. It was for his portrayal of Peter that Todd received two Mo Awards, the Variety Club Heart Award, the Glug Award, the Green Room Award, the Australian Dance Award and the Helpmann Award. Todd also won the 2005 Mo Award in the Versatile Variety Performer category.

Singin' In The Rain was a wonderful vehicle to see Todd at his dancing best as he recreated Gene Kelly's original choreography on stage. Todd received an Australian Dance Award for his performance.

Todd also appeared with Nancye Hayes in the Ensemble Theatre's production of Six Dance Lessons In Six Weeks, which toured Australia in 2007.

Balancing his roles in theatre and television, Todd's most recent theatre performances include him starring in *Priscilla Queen Of The Desert,* for which he received huge critical acclaim and a Helpmann Award nomination, and *Smoke And Mirrors,* which he performed at the Sydney Festival and most recently, at the Adelaide Festival.



CHRISTEN O°LEARY Judy Garland

This is Christen's third appearance with The Production Company; having worked previously in the productions of High Society and Hello, Dolly!




FEM BELLING Liza Minnelli

WHEN THE WAG FROM WILLIAMSTOWN MET THE BOY FROM OZ

Frank Van Straten salutes Australia's first hit musical.

STANDING OVATIONS!

It's June 1968, and Chequers nightclub in Sydney is packed for the Australian debut of a new international cabaret sensation. In the audience is a star-struck eighteen-year-old from Williamstown, Victoria. Along with the rest of the audience he cheers the work of the two young men whose act opens the show, and laughs when one of them introduces the star: 'And now,' he says, 'here's a young lady who happens to be related to one of the great names in show business – ladies and gentlemen, Mrs Peter Allen...'

As it turned out, Liza Minnelli was such a smash that the impact of the Allen Brothers, Chris and Peter, was all but forgotten. Just two years later, Peter and Liza had separated, the Allen Brothers gave their last performance, and that eager young man from Williamstown – Stephen MacLean was his name – had started his own life in show business, a life that would ebb and flow around the burgeoning career of his idol, Peter Allen.

Despite his lacklustre background, MacLean was obsessed with show biz. He loved Judy Garland, Frances Faye, and Peggy Lee. He read and listened and saw everything he could. Sheer persistence earned him a few bit parts as an actor; then a job at Crawford Productions saw him rise from

floor cleaner to floor manager. He wangled a stint with Jim Sharman on the original Rocky Horror Show. Eventually his knowledge of music and his ability as a writer led to work as a reporter for Go-Set magazine, the Australian pop scene's 'journal of record'.

He first met Peter Allen when, with his sister, Sheena, he talked his way backstage after a performance. Enthralled by Allen's talent and personality, MacLean followed his career assiduously, got to know him well, and interviewed him many times. He saw him perform all over

Australia, in London and in New York, and he filmed his Australian solo cabaret debut. He also became close to Marion Woolnough, Peter's mother, describing her, like Peter, as 'one of the great conversationalists.'

Meanwhile MacLean produced slick documentaries on Lee Gordon and Johnny O'Keefe for the ABC. He wrote and produced the semi-autobiographical film musical Starstruck (1982), and the quirky comedy Around the World in Eighty Ways.

In 1992, a few weeks after Peter Allen's death, he started work on a definitive biography of his idol. He also suggested to producer Ben Gannon that

Allen's life could be made into a film. It had been MacLean that had first brought Allen's work to Gannon's attention, way back in the early 1970s. Gannon thought it better to start with a documentary; the result was The Boy From Oz, produced by Gannon and written and directed by MacLean. It screened on ABC TV in 1995.

The biography, also called

The Boy From Oz, was published
the following year.


TOP: Liza Minnelli and the Allen Brothers at Chequers, Sydney, 1968 LEFT: Todd McKenney on stage, 1998 In 1996 Gannon and Robert Fox decided to use MacLean's work as the basis for a stage musical based on Allen's life and music. It was the first time an Australian writer-performer-musician had been portrayed this way. The show's book was commissioned from Nick Enright, whose 30 years in theatre included writing the musicals *The Venetian Twins, Summer Rain, Miracle City* and Mary Bryant. Stephen MacLean acted as consultant to the production. The work-in-progress was workshopped in January 1997.

Directed by Gale Edwards, *The Boy From Oz* premiered at Her Majesty's Theatre, Sydney, on 5 March 1998. 'Oh Boy – What a Joy!' said Leonie Bullions in *Sydney's Daily Telegraph*: 'The show is a triumph for Todd McKenney in the gruelling role of Peter Allen. He carries the role with grace and buckets of charm, and dances and sings like a dream. The show is one step ahead in that the songs are already familiar. But director Gale Edwards gives them a new twist by having the characters in Allen's life share the singing of them. The musical numbers have been used sensitively and intelligently to push the story forward and to illustrate episodes in Allen's life. It seems that finally Australia has produced what has eluded us for so long. A hit musical.'

And what a hit! The Boy From Oz toured widely for two years and was seen by more than a million Australians, making it the most successful musical ever created in this country. And, of course, it made a rolled-gold star of Todd McKenney. The initial cast also included Angela Toohey (Liza Minnelli), Chrissy Amphlett (Judy Garland) and Jill Perryman (Allen's mother). In a smaller role was Robyn Arthur, now our Marion Woolnough.

And then, just as Peter Allen had done, the show headed for Broadway. With Enright's book adapted by Martin Sherman, and a revision of the musical content, Gannon and Fox produced the show at the Imperial Theatre on Broadway with Hugh Jackman giving a Tony-winning performance as Allen. It opened on 16 October 2003 and packed the theatre for a year. A Japanese version followed in June 2005.

The show was revamped yet again for an enormously successful Australian 'arena' production with Hugh Jackman. Chrissy Amphlett and Angela Toohey reprised their portrayals of Garland and Minnelli, while Colleen Hewett played Allen's mother. Kenny Ortega directed. The tour opened at Sydney Entertainment Centre on 10 August 2006 and went on to play Melbourne, Adelaide, Brisbane and Perth.



Since the show has been released for nonprofessional productions, it has been seen from Launceston to Bankstown, from Tamworth to Mount Isa.

In April 2006, a few months before the arena tour started, Stephen MacLean died in Pattaya after a long battle with cancer of the oesophagus. He left his collection of Judy Garland memorabilia to Angela Toohey.

A few years before his death, MacLean told an interviewer: 'For someone who likes musicals, I often find them a laborsome experience to sit through. Somebody is talking, then they turn to sing in another voice. That always worried me and sent me running for the popcorn.'

Somehow, I don't think Stephen MacLean would have been running for the popcorn during *The Boy From Oz.*

NICK ENRIGHT

Original Book

One of Australia's foremost playwrights, Nick Enright gained early experience as an actor with J.C. Williamson's, Nimrod Theatre and the Melbourne Theatre Company.

He then attended New York University School of the Arts, where he studied playwriting with Israel Horovitz.

Nick's plays include On The Wallaby, Daylight Saving, St. James Infirmary, Mongrels, A Property of the Clan, The Quartet from Rigoletto, Blackrock, Good Works, Playgrounds, Chasing the Dragon, Spurboard and A Poor Student. With Justin Monjo, he adapted Tim Winton's Cloudstreet for Company B/Black Swan. The hugely successful production, directed by Neil Armfield, played in all Australian capital cities, London, Zurich, Dublin, Washington and New York.

Good Works and Cloudstreet both won Green Room Awards for Best Play. Cloudstreet also won a Writers' Guild Gold AWGIE award as did Daylight Saving, A Property of the Clan and Nick's screenplay for the film Blackrock based on his play.

With composer Terence Clarke, he wrote the musicals *The Venetian Twins* and *Summer Rain*. Other musical collaborations include *Miracle City* with Max Lambert and *Mary Bryant* with David King. Nick was one of the first to join the creative team for *The Boy From Oz* when Ben Gannon decided to develop a musical based on Peter Allen's life.

For film, Nick wrote Lorenzo's Oil with George Miller, which received Academy Award and Writers' Guild Award nominations for Best Original Screenplay. His television credits include Coral Island and the miniseries Come In Spinner. Many of Nick's plays have been broadcast and he also wrote original work for radio.

Nick was a regular teacher at WAAPA and NIDA and he developed work with both companies. His last play, A Man With Five Children, opened the Sydney Theatre Company's 2002 season.

Nick died in Sydney in March 2003.



Director

Actor, dancer, singer, choreographer and director Nancye Hayes OAM began her career in JC Williamson's production of My Fair Lady in 1961. However it was the title role of Sweet Charity in 1967 that established her name. During 2006/2007 Nancye starred opposite Todd McKenney in the sold out national tour of Six Dance Lessons In Six Weeks and her most recent stage appearance was as Madame Armfeldt in A Little Night Music for Opera Australia

Nancye is honoured to have received three Lifetime Achievement Awards - from the Variety Club in 1997, the Green Room Awards Association in 2003 and the Sydney Theatre Awards in 2009.

Nancye has recently completed a season at the Ensemble Theatre in the play *Murderers*. In February she commences a national tour in *Turn*, a play written by and also featuring Reg Livermore.






