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


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#### BILLE BROWN Lawrence Jameson

Bille Brown has an international acting, directing and writing career in theatre, film, and television. A former member of The Royal Shakespeare Company, The Chichester Festival Theatre and The New York Shakespeare Festival, he has performed on Broadway and theatres in Paris, Vienna and Berlin. # "I know funny when I see it!"

Frank Van Straten discovers that these charming con men have been around a very long time

For a 'new' musical, Dirty Rotten Scoundrels has a surprisingly long history. It's a history that could make a good play - or even a great musical!

#### Act One:

We flash back to Hollywood, 1964. At Universal Studios, writer-producer Stanley Shapiro has a new comedy film in production.

Shapiro specialised in a genre felicitously known as 'sex comedies' - undemanding programmers sometimes derisively dismissed as 'Doris Day' movies. Mr Shapiro sired a string of such successes, often with the dogged Miss Day co-starring with either Rock Hudson or Cary Grant - Pillow Talk (1959), Operation Petticoat (1959), Lover Come Back (1961), Come September (1961) and That Touch of Mink (1962).

It seemed to Shapiro entirely logical to concoct a film starring all three, Day, Hudson and Grant. In collaboration with Paul Henning, best known as a TV scriptwriter, he came up with an engaging comedy about two loveable con men, and set it in the sunny milieu of the French Riviera. He called it King of the Hill. Then, according to Shapiro, 'Cary had asked Rock to do the movie with him, but Rock

turned him down, and then Doris wouldn't do it without the two of them."

Shapiro refused to give up. After some tortuous negotiations he cast the urbane David Niven as Lawrence and young Marlon Brando as Freddy, with Shirley Jones as Janet. Along the way the film gained a more tantalising title, Bedtime Story - which prompted Universal to excitedly promote it as 'The sin-tillating capers of two cunning con men who fleeced the sexiest chicks on the Riviera'. Translated into French it was even more enticina: Les Séducteurs.

Niven stole most of the acting honours, while Brando relished the rare chance to show what he could do with broad comedy. He later admitted that he found Niven so funny that he often broke into uncontrollable laughter

during filming, ruining many takes. In the end he had to force himself not to look Niven in the eye when the camera was rolling.

Shapiro's substitute casting paid off. In his review in The New York Times, Bosley Crowther summed up: 'These two accomplished actors hit a comedy peak. Bedtime Story is a very funny picture, and Mr Brando is first-class farceur. Mark this one down as good, crisp fun.'



It's now 1987. A couple of years earlier, Mick Jagger and David Bowie achieved such a big hit with their Dancing in the Street video that they wanted to make a movie together. Jagger had written the title song for the film Ruthless People (1986) and been so impressed by Dale Launer's screenplay that

it seemed logical that they should invite Launer to participate in their film project.

'I got a call from David Bowie's production company,' recalled Launer, 'He and Jagger wanted to do a movie and hoped I would write it. I'd seen Bedtime Story in the late '60s on TV when I was home from school, so I suggested a remake with Bowie as Lawrence and Mick as Freddy. They were both interested, United Artists was interested, but the movie had to been made at Universal, who wouldn't release the rights. Turns out no-one had bothered to do a copyright search. I did. I found out that the rights had reverted back to the original writer-producer, Stanley Shapiro. We met at the Pink Turtle, a coffee shop in the old Beverly Wilshire, and did a deal on a napkin. 'Bedtime Story was a very charming movie

- which is why I tried to preserve as much of the original as possible. Hey, if ain't broke, don't fix it. And certainly don't change it though,' he admitted, 'I do prefer my ending."

Launer took his version of the screenplay to Orion Pictures, who contracted Herbert Ross to direct. After differences over the script, Ross was replaced by Frank Oz - he of Muppet Show fame. History was repeated when Jagger and

Bowie dropped out of the project. Steve Martin and Michael Caine were cast in their stead, with Glenn Headley as Janet.

As Dirty Rotten Scoundrels the film was released in December 1988, perfectly timed for the American holiday trade.

Noting the production's ancestry, New York Times critic Vincent

Candy said, 'Except for its title, the earlier film has receded from memory, but I can't imagine that it could have been anywhere near as entertaining as this blithe, seemingly all-new, laugh-out-loud escapade. It is a joy to watch. In this season of lazy, fat, mistimed and misdirected comedies, Dirty Rotten Scoundrels is an enchanted featherweight folly."

The film earned \$3,840,498 on its opening weekend and eventually grossed \$42,039,085 in the US alone.

#### Act Three:

It was only a matter of time before the 'enchanted featherweight folly' found its way to Broadway.





The venture was backed by a consortium of independent producers in association with MGM on Stage, a developer and licensor of films for the stage with a track record including the theatrical version of Chitty Chitty Bang Bang.

The project reunited three of the principal collaborators on the musical version of The Full Monty: composer-lyricist David Yazbek, director Jack O'Brien and choreographer Jerry Mitchell. The book was entrusted

to a Broadway newcomer, Jeffrey Lane, an Emmywinning television writer whose credits included Lou Grant,

Mad About You and Bette.

On 22 September 2004 the show opened an out-of-town try-out season at the Old Globe Theatre in San Diego, California, where O'Brien was artistic director. It moved to Broadway early in 2005 and had its official first night at the Imperial Theatre on 3 March 2005. John Lithgow and Norbert Leo Butz played Lawence and Freddy, with Sherie Rene Scott as Christine. Few of the first nighters would have detected David Yazbek's sly

> reference to the original Lawrence, David Niven, in his lyrics for the show's opening number, 'Give Them What They Want'.

The reviews were not all raves, and many compared the show's conniving con men to those of The Producers, which was still playing to packed houses. Still,



the 1940s and '50s. The creators' greatest inspiration is to put a modern spin on the conventions of the musical's so-called Golden Age, the time when every show didn't feel the need to be "about something". The result is played with such blissful innocence that scene after scene feels like the best of old-time burlesque.

The score, too, hearkens back to the past. David Yazbek could be a reincarnation, in one man, of the lamented Adler and Ross of The Pajama Game fame, who wrote for the stage but kept one eye on the pop charts. Yazbek is at home with both comedy numbers tied closely to context, and hummable stand-alone love songs."

And The Wall Street Journal's Terry Teachout beamed: 'I know funny when I see it, and this show is a perfect hoot!'


