

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

The King

American born Juan Jackson was touring Australia playing Sportin' Life in the Living Arts international production of Porgy & Bess, when he made the decision to relocate to the country in which he fell in love. The decision to live and work in Australia is one that he has never regretted. Juan then toured in Show Boat and Hair for The Production Company and Man of La Mancha for Gordon/Frost before he joined Opera Australia.

Juan returned to musical theatre in the role John in Miss Saigon. His critically acclaimed performances during the Australian tour resulted in a Helpmann Award nomination for Best Supporting Actor in a Musical. This was followed by the dual roles of

MacHeath and Harry Morton in Max Stafford Clarke's new production of *The Convict's Opera* for Sydney Theatre Company. After the Sydney season, the show toured extensively throughout the UK. Most recently Juan played John in TML's Korean tour of *Jekyll and Hyde*. Other roles and performances have included *Sweet Bird of Youth* for the Melbourne Theatre Company, Tony in *West Side Story* for Orlando Civic Theatre, *From The Lip* and *Teorema* for Chamber Made Opera, *The Merry Widow* and Brahms's *Liebeslieder Waltzes* for Opera Australia and *Chanticleer* and *The Music Shop* for South Georgia Opera. Other engagements include the Concert of American Music Theatre for the Australian Pops Orchestra and *Barber to Bernstein*, a concert with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra for the Sydney Festival. Juan has recorded a CD, *Old American Songs*, for ABC Classics.



SILVIE PALADINO

Silvie Paladino has established herself as one of Australia's most versatile and talented entertainers performing throughout Australia, Asia and on London's West End.



George was recently made a Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit (CNZM) for Services to the Theatre. She has performed with the Shanghai Philharmonic Orchestra as soprano soloist in Beethoven's *Symphony No.9*, and has appeared as Nedda in *I Pagliacci* for Melbourne City Opera and as the Countess in *The Marriage Of Figaro* for Melbourne Opera. For the Victorian College

Of Arts she has also appeared as Gilda in Rigoletto, Pamina in The Magic Flute, Zerlina in Don Giovanni, Mimi in La Bohéme and Juliet in Romeo & Juliet.

Emily has performed with internationally renowned pianist Alan Kogosowski and has been regularly engaged as a soloist for concerts with the Australian Pops Orchestra. She has given a recital tour of China, appeared as a soloist in a choral and orchestra concert in the Shanghai concert Hall and has recorded a CD for International Opera Productions in Prague. In 2009 Adrian toured with Broadway writing legends, Stephen Flaherty and Lynn Ahrens in Broadway To Australia. In the USA he played the role of Lun Tha in the premier of the newly-restored The King and 1 with the original Robert Russell Bennett orchestrations. Adrian also recently performed in The Music Of Georgia Stitt and An Evening With Lance Horne.

In New York, Adrian was seen in Ziegfeld's Midnight Frolic of '08, at Joe's Pub in Leap, and in Lance Horne, Or What You Will. Other favourite credits are Measure For Measure, The Seagull and Rent.

SOMETHING WONDERFUL

Frank Van Straten reveals the secrets of an unlikely success.

Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein II used to play a game. They'd dissect one of their successful shows, then try to work out why it should have failed. The King & I was a classic example – it should never have been a triumph.

To start with, few musicals up to that time had drawn upon the stories of real people for their plots. There were only four Anglo-Saxons in the cast, and none was American. There was no love interest between the main characters, and one of them died before the curtain fell. And it was also the first show Rodgers and Hammerstein had written with a particular star in mind, and that star, according to Rodgers, 'had never overcome an unfortunate tendency to sing flat'. Add to this a difficult working relationship between star and authors, and you hardly have the makings of a certain success.

The King & I had its genesis in the story of Anna Leonowens, an extraordinary Englishwoman who had married a major in the Indian Army, was widowed in 1858 at the age of 24, but continued to live in the East with her children. In 1862, she was engaged by King Mongkut of Siam (now Thailand) as governess for his 39 wives and 82 children. She related her experiences in two books, The English Governess at the Siamese Court and The Romance of the Harem.

Anna's story fascinated the English author Margaret Landon. By chance she met Anna's nephew, then tracked down Anna's grandchildren. The result was the novel Anna and the King of Siam, published in 1944. It became a worldwide best-seller.

Landon's book was filmed in 1946 with Irene Dunne and Rex Harrison. It won three Oscars; it also fired the imagination of the beloved stage veteran Gertrude Lawrence, who had not played in a musical since Lady in the Dark had closed in 1943. Her husband, Richard Aldrich, records that 'she was deeply intrigued by the unusual personal story of the governess and the King, the picturesque background, and the clash of attitudes between East and West – frequently comic, yet with overtones of sadness. Herein, she thought, lay rich possibilities for a beautiful musical play.'

Gertrude secured the rights to the book and made tentative plans for the production. Cole Porter was to write the score, Anton Dolin would supervise the choreography, Frederick Ashton and the Sadler's Wells Ballet were to come over from London for the dances, and Richard Aldrich would produce. In the end, all these plans came to nothing, and Gertie contracted Rodgers and Hammerstein to write, compose and produce her musical. 'At first our feelings were decidedly mixed,' wrote Rodgers. 'We had never

written a musical with one actor or actress in mind, and we were concerned that this might not give us the freedom to write what we wanted the way we wanted ... on the other hand, here was an opportunity to write for one of the theatre's genuine stars.'

With the 'I' a fait accompli, Rodgers and Hammerstein set about finding their King. After fruitless negotiations with Rex Harrison and Alfred Drake – a huge success in their

> Oklahoma! - they announced auditions. The first candidate." Rodgers recalled, 'was a bald, muscular fellow with a bony Oriental face. He was dressed casually and carried a guitar. He scowled in our direction. sat down on the stage and crossed his legs, then plunked one whacking chord on his guitar and began to howl in a strange language. He looked savage and there was no denying he projected a feeling of

controlled ferocity. Oscar and I looked at each other and nodded. His name was Yul Brynner."

The rest of the casting was less dramatic. Doretta Morrow as Tuptim, Dorothy Sarnoff as Lady Thiang, Larry Douglas as Lun Tha. The young princess Yin Yaowalak was played by little Baayork Lee, best remembered in this country as the director of the original Australian production of A Chorus Line.

Relations were soured at the first run-through when Gertrude Lawrence took exception to Rodgers' insistence that Doretta Morrow sing the part of Anna, as well as her own. As well, Gertie was suffering from the early stages of cancer.

There were several bold innovations. One was the use of

subtle woodwind underscoring to represent what was being said in Thai on stage; another was the inclusion of the lengthy ballet sequence based on *Uncle Tom's Cabin* – 'The Small House of Uncle Thomas'. This gentle, amusing 'play within a play', brilliantly

choreographed by Jerome Robbins, served to deftly mirror the central theme of *The King & I:* slavery.

And the play opened and closed without music.

Hammerstein later explained that he and Rodgers had sought 'an Eastern sense of dignity and pageantry, and none of this business of girls dressed in Oriental costumes and dancing out onto the stage singing 'ching-a-ling-ling' with their fingers in the air'. Rodgers' score was superb. He avoided slavishly trying to imitate authentic 'Siamese'

music, and came up with some of his loveliest melodies. Similarly, Hammerstein eschewed overly 'Orientalising' the speech of the King and his Court, and developed an abrupt, formal style, devoid of articles, that caught 'learned English' perfectly. The use of the word 'etcetera' is a masterstroke.

The production budget was US\$360,000, making it by far the most expensive of the Rodgers and Hammerstein musicals produced to that time.

When The King & I opened out-of-town in January, 1951, it was much too long. Forty-five minutes were cut: three songs, and many pages of dialogue. But something extra was needed.

something light for Gertie to sing with the children. The result was 'Getting to Know You', a last minute addition, utilising the melody of a song called 'Suddenly Lucky' that had been dropped from South Pacific.

The King & I finally opened on Broadway at the St James Theatre on 29 March 1951. The reviewers inevitably compared it to South Pacific, then still running, which had replaced Oklahoma! as a yardstick. Still, they were unanimous in their praise. Brooks Atkinson hailed it as 'a beautiful and lovable musical play', and Danton Walker said it represented 'a flowering of all the arts of theatre, with moments that are pure genius'. It won five Tonys and notched up 1,246 performances.

Gertrude Lawrence died in September 1952, and she was buried in her ball gown from *The King & I*. Her place was taken by Celeste Holm. Alfred Drake eventually took over from Yul Brynner, but it was Brynner who starred with Deborah Kerr in the lush CinemaScope film version, made



in 1956. Marni Nixon dubbed Anna's songs, and Brynner won an Oscar for his performance.

A Los Angeles production in 1958 starred Gisele MacKenzie and Cameron Mitchell. The


show was revived in New York in

1960 (with Barbara Cook and Farley Granger), in 1964 (with Rise Stevens and Darren McGavin), and in 1977 and 1985 (with Yul Brynner). In 1989 Rudolf Nureyev played the King in a production that toured the US and Canada.


The King & I reached London's Theatre Royal, Drury Lane, on 8 October 1953, with Valerie Hobson and Herbert Lom as Anna and the King. There was a revival at the Adelphi in 1973, with Sally Ann Howes and Peter Wyngarde, and an 'in-the-round' version at the Royal Albert Hall in 2009.

But what of Australia? Sir Frank Tait, managing director of J.C. Williamson's, who had presented Oklahoma! and South Pacific here, saw the show on Broadway, but he wasn't impressed. 'Very disappointed,' he wrote. 'Lawrence's voice mostly finished. Beautiful production of its kind, but I consider the whole thing much over-rated. Music nothing approaching South Pacific, but theatre packed.'

Thus it was left to an amateur group to bring *The King & I* down under. The Sydney Light Opera Company premiered it at the Orpheum Theatre, Cremorne, on 1 September 1960. Mary Cullen and









Russell Smith played the leads, Peter Barker designed the sets, and Lindsay Bird directed.

Two years later, on 22 December 1962, more than a decade after its Broadway debut, The King & I took the stage of Melbourne's Princess Theatre in an opulent production by Garnet H. Carroll. Carroll had already presented Rodgers and Hammerstein's The Sound of Music

in Australia (and he would later produce their Carousel in 1964). The director was an Englishman, Charles Hickman, well-known for his Sadler's Wells' Merry Widow, and for Carroll's production of The Sound of Music. The stars were Sheila Bradley and Jeff Warren.

Jeff Warren had made his Broadway debut in 1943, playing in Lady in the Dark with Gertrude Lawrence. His later successes included One Touch of Venus, Call Me Madam and, in London, Wedding in Paris, which Charles Hickman had directed. Sheila Bradley, whose credits included Kismet in London, had come to Australia for J.C. Williamson's to star in Grab Me A Gondola. Later the role of Anna was played by Helen Landis, also from London, and, in Sydney, by Susan Swinford, who had worked with Jeff Warren in Wedding in Paris.

There were other interesting names in Garnet H. Carroll's production, John Rickard was Lun Tha, Geraldene Morrow was Tuptim. Andrew Guild was Prince Chululongkorn and, for part of the run, Little Eva in the 'Small House' ballet was played by Patti McGrath. Eric Clapham conducted in Melbourne, and Isador Goodman took the baton in Sydney. The show subsequently toured to other state capitals.

The sets and costumes were spectacular. Most Australian productions of overseas shows used reproductions of the original designs, but Garnet H. Carroll was more adventurous than that. For The King & I he engaged a young Melbourne designer called John Truscott, a veteran of three years working with the busy little St. Martin's Theatre in South Yarra. John had earlier worked on the

> costumes for Carroll's production of West Side Story; he would go on to create the Australian, London and film versions of Camelot, and earn himself two Academy Awards.

> > In the past forty years Australia has seen countless amateur productions of The King & I, but few rofessional revivals. In January 1967 it was the inaugural production of the grandly titled, but ill-fated Warringah Mall Music Theatre Festival' in Sydney, designed to emulate




the American tradition of 'Summer Stock'. The shows were presented 'in-the-round' in a large tent that had previously housed the Great Moscow Circus. The cast included Rosalind Keene as Anna, Ed Deveraux as the King, Robert McPhee as Lun Tha, Helen Zerefos as Tuptim, Denis Quilley (fresh from playing in Robert and Elizabeth) as Sir Edward, and Andrew Guild, recreating his role as the young Prince. Jon Ewing

> directed. The January heat made the tent almost unbearable. and the venture was a financial disaster.

Perth saw a production by the West Australian Musical Comedy Company at His Majesty's in January, 1982. Tony Kentuck was the King with Terry Johnson as Anna and Christa Leahmann as Lady Thiang.

In 1991 Gordon/Frost



'The strength of The King & I,' said its creators, 'lies in the violent changes the King and Anna wrought in each other. Yet their life together bears unmistakable implications of deep mutual attraction - a man-and-woman relationship so strong, real and well-founded that it seems in some ways more than a love affair, more than a marriage."

The story is timeless. It is indeed 'Something Wonderful'. That's why it continues to enthral and delight, and why Anna Leonowens and her King have waltzed their way to immortality.







Her hobbies are swimming. singing, dancing and reading. Rachel is delighted to be a member of The King & I, her first appearance with The Production Company.

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
