

I was on the Board of the Victoria State Opera when Ken Mackenzie-Forbes, the current Artistic Director of The Production Company, produced a superb production of *West Side Story.* This toured Australia in 1994 and 1995. His Production Stage Manager back then was our Technical Director David Miller, his Assistant Company Manager was our Executive Director Rachel D Taylor and the Publicist was one of our Board Members John Hay-Mackenzie. We have all been working together as an indomitable team for the last sixteen years. I couldn't love them more and they have helped me make The Production Company the success it is today.

West Side Story is a work of extraordinary collaborative genius (Leonard Bernstein, Jerome Robbins, Arthur Laurents and Stephen Sondheim) and it requires an extraordinary cast and creative team. Our Anita, Deone Zanotto and our Bernardo Adam Fiorentino have both starred on London's West End and on Broadway. Gareth Keegan, a truly heart-throb tenor in my opinion, whom you will remember from Show Boat and The Pirates of Penzance, returns to us as Tony.

In short, we have hired the best talent around. Welcome back to performers who have been with us before and welcome to the new performers, some of whom are making their professional debuts in *West Side Story*.

Greatly admired and recognised with many awards, Gale Edwards directs her fourth show for us and Music Director Guy Simpson enjoys our company so much he is back for his 14th musical! I welcome back our superb designers Tim Chappel, Shaun Gurton and Trudy Dalgleish and the expert team from System Sound. I also hope this is the first of many collaborations we will have with Melbourne's clever, young choreographer Michael Ralph.

ANZ are a major supporter of The Production Company and I thank them for sponsoring *West Side Story.* My company is entirely privately funded and relies on private support for its ongoing existence. If you are helping us already and your names are listed in this program, I am so grateful. We couldn't do it without you.

Of course, Stephen Sondheim put it better than I ever could - "The air is humming and something great is coming!"

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

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

ANNA O'BYRNE Maria

Born in Melbourne and now based in London, Anna has established an international career spanning musical theatre, opera, theatre, concert, and film. Following her graduation from The Victorian College of the Arts, Anna became a Principal Artist at Victorian Opera singing Polly Peachum in *The Threepenny Opera* (Malthouse Theatre co-production), The Gossip in *Angélique*, and Pamina in *The Magic Flute*.

Anna was chosen by Andrew Lloyd Webber to create the role of Christine Daaé in the Australian premiere of *Love Never Dies*. Anna was nominated for Sydney Theatre and Green Room awards for her performance. Lauded as the definitive production of this musical, *Love Never Dies* was filmed and released in cinemas internationally by Universal Pictures. Following this, Anna made her West End debut as Christine in *The Phantom of the Opera* (Her Majesty's Theatre). She created the role of Jenny Lind in Cameron Mackintosh's *Barnum* (Chichester Festival Theatre), the process of which was featured in the documentary *The Sound of Musicals* (Channel 4). Anna then returned to the West End in *Strangers on a Train* (Gielgud Theatre), and as Anne Egerman in *A Little Night Music* (Palace Theatre). In 2015 she made her English National Opera debut in *Sweeney Todd* (London Coliseum), starring Bryn Terfel and Emma Thompson.

Anna became the first actress to perform as Christine in *The Phantom of the Opera* in Russia, which was broadcast nationally from the Bolshoi Theatre. She regularly performs internationally in concert, and has sung for royalty, world leaders and dignitaries.


TONY RICKARDS



FRANK VAN STRATEN TRACES THE EXTRAORDINARY JOURNEY OF WEST SIDE STORY

In a diary note dated 6 January 1949, composer Leonard Bernstein wrote: 'Jerry R. [director-choreographer Jerome Robbins] called today with a noble idea: a modern version of *Romeo and Juliet* set in slums at the coincidence of Easter–Passover celebrations. Feelings running high between Jews and Catholics. Former: Capulets; latter: Montagues. Juliet is Jewish. Friar Lawrence is a neighbourhood druggist. Street brawls, double death. It all fits. If it can work, it's a first.'

In fact Shakespeare's best-loved play was not really original. Its genesis was Masuccio Salernitano's novel *Mariotto and Gianozza*, published in Italy in 1476. This inspired Luigi de Porto's *Giulietta e Romeo* of 1530 and Matteo Bandella's *Giulietta e Romeo* of 1554. In 1562 British poet Arthur Brooke reworked Bandella's story into a narrative poem, *The Tragicall Historye of Romeus and Juliet* – which was the starting point for Shakespeare. His *Romeo and Juliet* was first performed around 1595. Interestingly, Shakespeare also used Bandello plots in *Much Ado about Nothing* and *Twelfth Night*.

Of course all this was of little consequence to Bernstein and Robbins, who had previously worked together in 1944 on the ballet *Fancy Free* and its expansion into the musical *On the Town*. Their great challenge was to create a new kind of musical. As Bernstein put it: 'to tread the fine line between opera and Broadway, between realism and poetry, ballet and "just dancing", abstract and representational.' It was to be a long journey.

Robbins and Bernstein worked on the show on and off for eight years. Along the way writer Arthur Laurents and lyricist Stephen Sondheim joined the creative team, producers came and went, Bernstein wrote and premiered *Candide*, and the milieu for the new show (tentatively titled *Gangway*) shifted from Jewish–Catholic conflicts in New York's

Lower East Side to troubles with Chicano Americans in the slums of the city's Upper West Side. So *West Side Story* it was.

The show premiered in Washington on 19 August 1957. 'The opening last night was just as we dreamed it,' wrote Bernstein. 'All the agony and postponements and re-re-re-writing turn out to have been worth it. I am now convinced that what we dreamed all these years is possible; because there stands that tragic story, with a theme as profound as love versus hate, with all the theatrical risks of death and racial issues and young performers and "serious" music and complicated balletics – and it all added up for audience and critics. I laughed and cried as though I'd never seen or heard it before.' Most surprising was the audience's acceptance of the story's downbeat end. 'Not even a whisper about a happy ending has been heard,' said Bernstein. 'A rare thing on Broadway.'

The show opened at the Winter Garden on 26 September 1957. Rapturously received, it was nominated for six Tony Awards, but won only two, for Best Choreography and Best Scenic Design. It notched up 732 performances, toured widely, then returned to Broadway for another 253 performances. It did even better in London, where it achieved a 1039-performance run. There were major revivals on Broadway in 1964, 1980 and 2009, and in London in 1998, 2008 and 2013. The film version, released in 1961, won ten Academy Awards, including Best Picture.

In 1960 West Side Story arrived 'Down Under', courtesy of entrepreneur Garnet H. Carroll, who ran the Princess Theatre in Melbourne. His chief rival was J.C. Williamson's, which had just scored a sensational success with My Fair Lady and Carroll needed something to match it. West Side Story was his answer. Carroll had seen the show in New York and again in London. 'The tremendous impact of this exciting musical made me more anxious than ever to bring it to Australia,' he said, though he would need to import an unprecedented number of American performers.

Carroll's main recruits were Joe Calvan, the show's original stage manager, who would reproduce Jerome Robbins' direction, and Ben Vargas, 'Bernardo' on Broadway, who would recreate the role in Australia and replicate Robbins'

choreography. Dobbs Franks, a protégé of Leonard Bernstein, would be musical director. He had already conducted the show's US tour. This trio chose most of the Jets and Sharks. Because Robbins' signature choreography was unknown in Australia, Equity agreed to the mass importation, provided that locals gradually replaced them during the run. Eventually the 'biggest theatrical airlift' to that time brought 26 people to Australia.

Meanwhile the Broadway set and lighting designs were meticulously copied. 'I think we were the first Australian management to reproduce an overseas lighting plot,' claimed John Carroll who, because of his father's failing health, assumed control of the production. The costumes were entrusted to young local designer, John Truscott. 'You must remember,' said Carroll, 'that jeans were

virtually unknown in Australia then, so John had to have them specially made. The same with the gym boots: there was nowhere to buy them, so they were all hand made in Melbourne.'

Dobbs Franks recalled: 'Australia was like another world, especially for the youngsters in the cast. There was the quaintness of the trams, the peculiar currency, right hand drive, and the nonsense of six o'clock closing. And I remember having to learn a new musical language. The musos had never heard of guarter notes and eighth notes, so I had to change over to crotchets and quavers. It was a difficult score and we needed lots of rehearsals. We had a band of about 32 - more than in New York, because our guys couldn't double instruments as much. The Princess had the best theatre orchestra in Australia, and they loved the music, even though it was so hard.'

John Carroll remembered the first orchestra call: 'The guys were stunned because Dobbs turned up not only in jeans, but also in a denim jacket. They'd never seen anything like it! And he never used a score. He knew the whole thing backwards - at 27! All the other theatre conductors in Australia were aged in their 50s and 60s.'

There were no microphones, and rehearsals revealed that the orchestra was too loud. 'It was a hard score to play quietly, explained Franks, 'I said I thought the pit floor was too high. To my astonishment they managed to lower it over a weekend.'

West Side Story premiered at the Princess on 29 October 1960. Overnight, My Fair Lady, which had just concluded

its first Melbourne run, seemed a little passé. The audience gave Bernstein and Sondheim's vibrant musical tragedy an enthusiastic welcome, though the Lord Mayor, Sir Bernard Evans, sniffed, 'You'd never get delinguents like that in Melbourne.

The young American Jets and Sharks were well trained but totally undisciplined. 'They were just kids,' recalled Phil A'Vard, who played Officer Krupke and doubled as assistant stage director. 'They used to lounge around outside the stage door and sit on the parked cars, smoking. There was a lot of tension between them, and one of them pulled a knife on me. Some were really guite violent, and all of them a long way from home. They were unused to the attention they were getting.

In December the Carrolls slotted in a pantomime, which played twice daily while West Side Story continued in the evenings. 'It was bizarre,' said A'Vard. 'We had two completely different casts and shows in the theatre at the same time - except that somehow the gym set in West Side Story became the Royal Palace in Puss in Boots.

In February 1961 West Side Story transferred to the Tivoli in Sydney. By the time the season ended, many of the Americans had been replaced by locals - notably Patsy Hemingway, who succeeded Wendy Waring as Maria.

Most of the Americans returned home. None went on to showbiz fame, though Bob Kole, who had been perfect as Tony, did record a couple of albums. Others like Ronne Arnold (Luis), Ernest Parham (Indio) and Rita Tanno (Anita) had notable careers in Australia. Rita became a theatrical agent and married actor Gus Mercurio. Paul Mercurio is their son. Dobbs Franks contributed mightily to music in this country. Of the young locals, Terry Donovan achieved a varied career on stage and television; Phil A'Vard had a long association with the Alexander Theatre at Monash University; and John Truscott won two Academy Awards, designed the interiors of Arts Centre Melbourne and worked on Brisbane's Expo '88.

West Side Story has enjoyed several major Australian revivals. The first opened at Her Majesty's in Sydney in May 1983 and moved to the Princess in September. Dobbs Franks directed and conducted. Tony and Maria were played by Philip Gould and Rosemary Harris.

A new production at the Princess in February 1994 was jointly produced by Ken Mackenzie-Forbes and James Erskine for Victoria State Opera and International Management Group. Ian Judge directed a cast including Marina Prior (Maria), Sean McDermott (Tony), Caroline O'Connor (Anita), Adam Marchant (Bernardo) and Todd McKenney (Riff). Brian Stacey conducted. This production played twice at the Capitol in Sydney. The leads for its second visit were Peter Cousens and Maree Johnson.

The third revival, in 2010, was based on the 2008 London production. Its backers included Michael Brenner. Harold Panter's Ambassador Theatre Group, James Cundall's Lunchbox Theatricals and David

Atkins Enterprises. Leading the cast were Josh Piterman (Tony), Julie Goodwin (Maria), Alinta Chidzey (Anita), Nigel Turner-Carroll (Bernardo) and Rohan Browne (Riff). Joey McKneeley directed and Vanessa Scammell conducted. The show played at the Regent in Melbourne.

And now the Sharks and the Jets are back, as electrifying as ever, in the show that nearly sixty years ago the New York Daily News reviewer John Chapman described as Extraordinarily exciting... a provocative and artful blending of music, dance and plot. Indeed, as Leonard Bernstein so cogently put it: 'It all fits.'

In 2013 Nat was given the role of a lifetime as father to his beautiful daughter, Taj.




ROSS CHISARI

Shaun is currently designing for Georgy Girl - The Seekers Musical.



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
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
